Virginia Health Benefit Exchange

Overview and Status Update for the Exchange Advisory Committee

December 7, 2020





Exchange Overview:

- Purpose: to facilitate the purchase and sale of qualified health plans (QHPs) and qualified dental plans (QDPs) to support the continuity of coverage and reduce the number of uninsured Virginians
- New division of SCC – the Health Benefit Exchange Division – created on July 1, 2020. Victoria Savoy is serving as Director.
- Funding for the Exchange will be generated by assessments on carriers offering plans through the Exchange (38.2-6510)
 - Use limited by statute to Exchange operations, outreach, enrollment, etc.
 - Assessment begins 1/1/21 at .5% of premiums charged by carriers for health and dental plans issued on the Exchange
 - The state budget authorizes the use of Working Capital Advances of up to \$40 million over 10 years to fund start-up and other implementation costs. \$6 million was drawn down by the Commission on July 1, 2020 to fund start-up costs.
- For Plan Years 2021/2022: State-based Exchange on the Federal Platform (SBE-FP), then transition to full State-based Exchange.
- Enrollment and eligibility continue through HealthCare.gov until plan year 2023.



Exchange Objectives:

- Make qualified health plans and qualified dental plans available in Virginia and provide for the establishment of a Small Business Health Options Program.
- Promote a transparent and competitive marketplace.
- Promote consumer choice and education.
- Assist individuals with access to programs, policies, and procedures, premium assistance tax credits, and cost-sharing reductions to support the continuity of coverage and reduce the number of uninsured.



Implementations to date:

- Two navigator groups – the Virginia Poverty Law Center and Boat People SOS, Inc. - awarded ~ \$1.8 million in grant funding for enrollment, education, and outreach functions.
- Navigators – transitioning to being certified by the HBE.
- Contracted with firm for development of operational framework for Navigators, setting strategic goals, and development of tools for monitoring Navigators.
- Adoption of new *Rules Governing the Certified Application Counselor Program*: Certified Application Counselor Designated Organizations (CDOs) – now required to meet Virginia designation standards effective 1/1/21.



Implementations cont.:

- Marketing – contracted with firm for advertising campaign for current Open Enrollment. Campaign targets uninsured and underinsured using census data to direct outreach in areas with higher percentage of uninsured. Using social media ads, digital banners, newspaper, and radio. In English and Spanish.
- Outreach and Education – Outreach plan created to focus efforts to reach target populations and ensure VA consumers know where to shop and enroll, educate consumers about options, maximize use of assisters, and meet accessibility needs.
 - Outreach materials in English, Korean, Spanish, and Vietnamese provided to assisters for their use in education and enrollment assistance.
 - Exchange website and hotline established to provide consumers information and direction to Healthcare.gov and assisters.
 - Stakeholder consultation: Outreach efforts made to over 300 relevant stakeholders inviting suggestions for achieving the goals of the Exchange.



Coordinated activities between HBE and BOI:

- Certification of QHP's and QDP's by HBE, in consultation with BOI
- BOI retains Plan Management functions that support certification
- Premium rates and policy forms approved by or filed with BOI
- Health carriers must be licensed and in good standing with BOI
- Navigators and CDOs must register with BOI
- Agents and Brokers required to be licensed and in good standing with BOI
- Hotline operated by BOI staff – managed by HBE
- Completion of Open Enrollment Readiness Reviews


